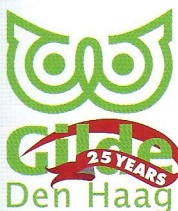

Introduction of Gilde Den Haag (The Hague Guild) to the expatriate community

What is The Hague Guild?

The Hague Guild, or Gilde Den Haag as we are known in Dutch, is a not-for-profit foundation that has been a centre of knowledge for the Hague area for more than twenty years. More than three hundred volunteers offer services, based on their professional experience, to younger and older people, from starting entrepreneurs to pensioners, in a variety of fields such as computer techniques, foreign languages and guided tours. The aim is to transfer their knowledge and experience.

One of the longstanding activities is the organisation of city walks led by experienced guides. The Hague has a long history as the administrative and government centre, as the residence of the Royal Family (House of Orange), and as a city where many international institutions and embassies are located. This has led to its recognition as International City of Peace and Justice.

What can The Hague Guild offer the expat community?

The Guild takes to heart The Hague's municipal policy to create an enjoyable working and living environment for the expat community. Excursions in the historical centre and other interesting parts of their temporary residence can contribute considerably to the families' sense of feeling at home in our beautiful city.



We have developed two excursions that we feel will be of special interest for expats.

The first is the so called "Residence Walk", which gives an exciting insight in two historically symbiotic parts of The Hague: the old village "Die Haghe" with its narrow streets and the elegant area around the Knights' Hall, which has been the administrative centre since the Middle Ages.

The second walk explores the locations that highlight the past, present and future of "The Hague, International City of Peace and Justice".

Both walks are led by one of our small, selected group of knowledgeable, voluntary guides. These guides are proud of The Hague's historic and cultural heritage and look forward to sharing their knowledge with the expat community.
